This letter outlines the areas of study we will cover during this term.

### Maths

In maths the children will be working with numbers up to 1000 and developing their understanding of place value. They will continue to solve calculations and problems, developing their mastery of maths in a range of real life contexts. They will be building on their knowledge of the properties of 2D and 3D shape and fractions. Every day we will be practising our times tables and they will be able to work on these skills at home by logging onto *Times Table Rock Stars*.

### English

In English the children will be comparing different stories by the same author, looking at books linked to our topics and using their own ideas in their writing. They will also be writing recounts and exploring a range of poetry. The children will continue to work on their understanding and use of grammar and develop their comprehension skills through a range of texts in our daily guided reading lessons.

### Our other subject themes this term:

- Our topic this term is 'Scavengers and settlers' where we will be looking at prehistory and the clues historians have that help us understand our Stone Age, Bronze Age and Iron Age. We also have an exciting trip to Ipswich Museum on to link in with our topic.
- Science – We are studying science in weekly blocks each half term. Our first topic is 'Plants'. After half term we will be continuing our plants topic.
- Music – We will be exploring pitch and structure in music as well as lots of singing! Year 3 children will be learning to use percussion instruments.
